NAVIGATING THE CMP PROCESS

Some of you may know that I am serving as temporary CMP Chair for NJRID. I am learning that the process is intricate with many facets to understand, but I want the membership to know that I am doing my best to submit your CEUs in a timely manner and with proper authentication. Following are bullet points of information that will help the CEU submission process run more smoothly.

PARTICIPANT-INITIATED NON-RID ACTIVITY FORM (PINRA)

- PINRAs are used for earning CEUs when attending professional development opportunities offered by numerous entities that may or may not necessarily be involved with the interpreting field. Example: a conference or class that may or not be related to the interpreting field and that is not held at an accredited institution.
- Completed PINRA form must be emailed and approved by the CMP chair PRIOR to the activity as soon as possible. A minimum of two weeks before the event is preferable. You may email a PINRA form with the top portion filled out (the part that pertains to contact and event information) to: grace_samis@mac.com.
- Following the event, provide copies of registration, conference agenda or other documentation that identifies content, hours and attendance to NJRID CMP chair. Feel free to email this information to grace_samis@mac.com at the conclusion of the event.
- The PINRA form, fee schedule and CMP chair's address can be found on www.nj-rid.org website on the CEU/CMP page.
- Finally, send the approved PINRA form, accompanying documentation and check made out to NJRID to:

- CEUs will be submitted to RID within 45 days after submission to NJRID.

ACADEMIC COURSEWORK

- ACADEMIC COURSEWORK form is used to apply to NJRID for CEUs when attending accredited institutions of higher learning.
- Accreditation of the school must be recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.
- Academic units will be converted to CEUs on the basis of 1-quarter credit hour equaling 10 contact hours (1 CEU) and 1 semester credit hour equaling 15 contact hours (1.5 CEUs).
- Submission of the completed Academic Coursework Activity Plan/Report and appropriate fee should be sent to NJRID's CMP Chair along with the course outline, syllabus, or course description from the course catalog and payment

of the appropriate fee and your grade report transcript after completing the course.

- Successful completion is defined as receiving a passing grade (pass or letter grade of C [2.0 GPA] or above). Pass/Fail courses will be processed as a PINRA.
- ACADEMIC COURSEWORK PLAN/ACTIVITY form, fee schedule and CMP chair's address can be found on www.nj-rid.org website under CEU/CMP tab.

NOTE: Presenters may receive General Studies CEUs for teaching an approved activity.

What strategies do interpreters use when reaching an impasse in the process and how do we recognize our contribution to teaming situations? This workshop will explore both intrapersonal and interpersonal dynamics of team interpreting through lecture, group discussion, and creative activities designed to enhance learning. Time for reflection and personal inquiry will be part of this interactive approach. This workshop is open to both Deaf and hearing interpreters and is worth .55 CEU/ACET credits.
